Who was Ronald E. McNair?

Ronald E. McNair was a scholar, physicist, jazz musician, karate black belt, family man and NASA astronaut. He was born in 1950 in Lake City, South Carolina. He attended North Carolina A&T State University where he earned a B.S. in physics in 1971. He received his Ph.D. in physics at the age of 26 from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1976.

While a member of the Hughes Research Laboratory, McNair gained recognition as an expert in laser physics. He was selected by NASA for the space shuttle program in 1978 and was a mission specialist aboard the 1984 flight of Challenger. Tragically, McNair was a team member of the ill-fated 1986 Challenger flight which ended his life.

In 1986 Congress passed legislation implementing the Ronald E. McNair Post-baccalureate Achievement Program in memory and honor of this outstanding individual. McNair personally demonstrated that hard work and determination in conjunction with proper preparation can significantly expand one's possibilities.

In 1999, Hunter College-CUNY joined ranks with prestigious universities such as Brandeis, Purdue, Rutgers University and the University of California, Berkeley in providing the McNair Program to competitively selected undergraduates. Funded by a grant from the U. S. Department of Education, the McNair Program of Hunter College is one of only 179 McNair Programs nationwide.

Who is Eligible?

- The McNair Program is for Hunter College-CUNY undergraduates (matriculated or enrolled students only) who are U.S. Citizens, <u>OR</u> Naturalized Citizens, <u>OR</u> Permanent Residents who have <u>NOT</u> earned a B.A. or B.S. degree.
- Hunter College students who are low-income <u>and</u> first-generation college students (your parent (s) or legal guardian(s) have not earned bachelor's degree), <u>OR</u>
- Hunter College students who are members of groups underrepresented in graduate education in the United States (American Indian/Alaskan Native, Hispanic, Black non-Hispanic), AND
- Students who completed more than 60 credits earning a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher.

Requirements

Acceptance into the McNair Scholars Program is competitive. All applicants must fulfill the following requirements including:

- A completed application including financial documentation
- One to two-page personal statement
- Writing sample (5 to 10 pages)
- Two letters of recommendation from college faculty members.
- An Interview

Financial Documentation

- Your most recent 1040 tax form, or
 Your parent's 1040 if they claim you as a
 dependent <u>and</u> current Student Aid Report (SAR)
 if you receive financial aid. <u>OR</u>
- An income verification letter from Public Assistance, Social Security or another government agency <u>and</u> current Student Aid Report (SAR) if you receive financial aid.
