The Fiscal Research Division (FRD), a nonpartisan staff agency of the North Carolina General Assembly, is recruiting for a knowledgeable individual with financial analysis skills to evaluate the budgetary impacts of North Carolina's Medicaid program for the North Carolina General Assembly. The preferred qualifications for a candidate include the following:

- Demonstrated ability to conduct actuarial, financial, and/or statistical forecasting of cash flow and budgetary needs for a public health care third-party payer program;
- Practical experience using cost and utilization data to estimate budgetary savings or costs due to program changes in a public health care financing program;
- Working experience with a federal or state Medicaid program, State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP), or other similar public health care program at the state or federal government level;
- Demonstrated knowledge about the major components of the health care marketplace including the interaction between medical/drug providers, public/private payers of claims and utilization behavior of beneficiaries; and
- Capability to manage business relationships with professional services firms, such as actuaries and health care consultants.

The preferred qualifications above will be considered in conjunction with additional general requirements listed throughout this Vacancy Announcement.
