
Men's Health: A Silent Health Crisis



Why do men need a health advocate?

- 80% of Suicide deaths are men.
- Between ages 10-18, boys are four to five times more likely than girls to commit Suicide.
- Approximately 30,000 men die of *Prostate Cancer* each year.
- Men are increasingly Isolated From Their Families due to work or divorce.
- Over 60% of High School Drop-Outs are boys.
- Men suffer 92% of the Fatal Workplace Injuries.
- 80% of those who have serious *Drug* Addictions are men.
- 80% of the *Homeless* on America's streets are men and 35% of those are *Vietnam Veterans*.
- Men are more likely than women to suffer *Psychological Problems and Mental Illness* and 25 times more likely to be sentenced to *Prison*.
- Nearly 80% of all Homicide victims are male. 50% of domestic violence is committed against men.
- Life Expectancy for men is 5 years less than for women.

- Development of original health informational brochures and literature hand-outs
- Web site content
- Represent MHN at trade shows and public policy events
