SUMMARY:

The Teen Outreach Reproductive CHallenge, known as TORCH[®], is a nationally recognized program that combines peer sexual and reproductive health education and leadership training for New York City teens. TORCH Peer Leaders build their self-esteem, develop leadership skills, and learn to make responsible choices. Then they share their knowledge with other teens by facilitating workshops around New York City.

The Summer Leadership Institute (SLI) is a 4-6 week summer program that brings TORCH Peer Leaders together for intensive sexuality education and leadership training.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Interns provide hands-on assistance to a diverse and dynamic group of high school students from all five boroughs of New York City who are involved in this nationally recognized program.

- Plan and implement daily activities for the TORCH Summer Leadership Institute.
- Help develop and organize resource materials for Peer Leaders.
- Assist with program evaluation efforts.
- Track outreach efforts and their results.
- Mentor TORCH peer leadership positions.
- Work as a part of the TORCH team.
- Travel to workshop locations to observe Peer Leader workshops.
- Assist TORCH Program staff with other tasks as necessary.
