Robert Eads, a trans man who is dying of ovarian cancer, is determined to live long enough to lead a panel on intimacy with his partner, Lola Cola, at the annual transgender Southern Comfort conference. In this moving documentary, Kate Davis explores issues of community, love, family, stigma and healthcare as Eads is turned down by provider after provider, who fear that treating him would hurt their reputations. Winner of the Grand Jury Prize, Documentary Competition, 2001 Sundance Film Festival, the Special Audience Award at the Berlin Film Festival, First Prize at the Seattle Film Festival and more.
