- Recruit participants
- Administer community-based surveys and focus groups
- Assist in the translation of documents

- Familiarity with minority and immigrant communities in NYC
- Commitment to working in underserved communities
- Bilingual in at least one of the following languages: Vietnamese, Cambodian, Arabic
