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Dr. Mostashari's work covers a range of topics related to helping clinicians improve care and patient health through health IT, focusing on small practice transformation by developing innovative payment models that better support these types of practices.

Until 2013, Dr. Mostashari was the U.S. National Coordinator for Health Information Technology at the Department of Health and Human Services. Prior to this, he also served as Assistant Commissioner for the Primary Care Information Project at the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. In that capacity, he facilitated the adoption of prevention-oriented health information technology by more than 1,500 providers in underserved communities. Dr. Mostashari also led the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-funded NYC Center of Excellence in Public Health Informatics and an Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality-funded project focused on quality measurement at the point of care.
