- Students must be currently enrolled in a graduate program in the greater New York City region
- Students must provide an academic mentor at their institution who can help guide research
- Both Financial Need and Academic Merit are key criteria
- Public Health and International Studies students strongly encouraged to apply

- To address merit, please provide your most recent transcripts
