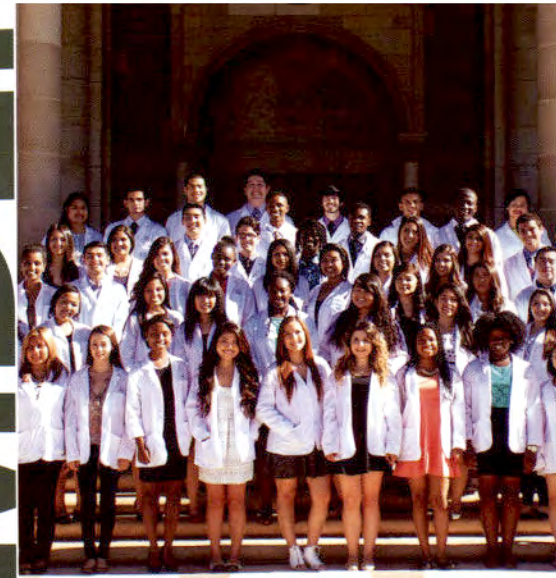

SMDEP is a national program funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation with direction and technical assistance provided by the Association of American Medical Colleges and the American Dental Education Association.

SMDEP is a **FREE** six-week academic summer enrichment program for college freshman and sophomore students who are interested in the field of medicine or dentistry. SMDEP is offered at 12 participating dental and medical schools. During the summer, students participate in the following activities.

- Academic enrichment in the basic sciences and math
- Career development activities
- Learning skills workshop or sessions
- Exposure to clinical settings
- Workshops in financial planning and health policy

To be eligible for SMDEP, an applicant must:

- Be a college freshman or sophomore.
- Have an overall GPA of 2.5.
- Be a U.S. citizen or hold a permanent resident visa.

Other factors that are considered include that a student:

- identifies with a group that is racially/ethnically underrepresented in medicine or dentistry (as defined by each site);
- comes from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background;
- has demonstrated an interest in issues affecting underserved populations.
