Congratulations on your MCAT Score! My name is CPT Christiaan D. Taylor, and I am writing to provide information on a unique financial opportunity the United States Army can provide for Medical School. The name of the program is the F. Edward Hébert Health Professions Scholarship Program.

If you are planning to attend, or are currently enrolled in Medical School, the Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) offers you an outstanding opportunity for financial support.
