COST OF STUDY, FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND HOUSING

For the 2015–2016 academic year tuition for out-of-state students is \$37,900; for residents of Pennsylvania it is \$36,276. We anticipate a modest 2–3% increase for the 2016 academic year.

The cost of living, excluding tuition and fees, is estimated to be \$20,000 per year for a single student.

Financial assistance is available in the forms of loans, college work-study, and scholarships. TUSPM is dedicated to helping ease the financial burden of a podiatric medical education. More than \$800,000 in scholarships is awarded annually to students in all four classes. About 90 percent of TUSPM students receive some type of financial assistance. Students should contact

Our on-campus housing complex is able to accommodate 127 students and offers one to three-bedroom apartments. The Office of Student Affairs maintains a list of other convenient housing opportunities.

APPLYING TO TUSPM

The Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine participates in the American Association of Colleges of Podiatric Medicine Application Service (AACPMAS), which allows students to complete a single set of application forms for admission to the nine colleges of podiatric medicine. An electronic web-enabled application is available for completion online at www.e-aacpmas.org. Admission is for the fall session only. Requirements include a BS, BA, or 90 undergraduate credits, which must include six credit hours of English and eight credit hours each of inorganic chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics. All science courses must include a lab. Letters of evaluation are also required (of which one must be a podiatric medical physician, and either one from a college pre-health advisory committee or two from science professors). Applications are incomplete until their Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) scores have been received. Additionally, we invite you to apply for the School's free winter or summer internship programs, which are typically held the first week of January and June.
