That's why clinical outreach is a focus of the M.D. curriculum, providing real-world clinical experience as soon as you set foot on campus. The M.D. program's rigorous classroom instruction prepares students for residency through team- and problem-based learning.

Curriculum experiences include:

First Patient Project

- Collaborate with fellow students in anatomy on a project or case study under the guidance of faculty, residents and fourth-year medical students.
- Teams will present their projects during an annual seminar, with the opportunity to publish their findings in established medical publications.

Outreach

- Volunteer through more than 30 student-run clinics and medical outreach organizations.
- Gain valuable clinical experience by providing needed care to Detroit's underserved populations.

Learning Communities

Collaborate with your peers and mentors to study, socialize and problem-solve together in small groups or "Wayne Houses."

Research

Participate in research and publish in our student journal, The Journal of Team Hippocrates.

Co-Curricular Program

Through the Co-Curricular Program, you have a unique opportunity to engage with the community as you fulfill degree requirements and build on volunteer work completed during your first year.
