



SHPEP @ WesternU

Western University of Health Sciences is one of thirteen national SHPEP program sites. WesternU offers a summer enrichment program for college freshmen and sophomores who are interested in the health professions such as medicine, dentistry, physical therapy, optometry, podiatry, pharmacy, nursing and physician assistant. During the six week course, students will experience:

- Academic enrichment of basic sciences through case-based learning;
- Hands-on clinical skills development activities;
- Learning skills evaluation and workshops;
- Exposure to clinical settings and clinical skills training;
- Workshops on financial planning and health policy;
- Free-of-Cost of double occupancy dorm room and meals at Pitzer College covered
- Receive a living stipend and have partial travel to and from the program expensed

FAQs

Do I need a car for this program?

NO. All program transportation is provided free of cost.

Can I bring my own car to the program?

YES. Free parking will be provided at both WesternU and the Claremont Colleges

How many students will be admitted to WesternU's program?

80 students total will be admitted into the program.

Do I get college credit for the program?

NO. This program is intended to enhance your preparation for medicine, dentistry, physical therapy and other health professions. It is not a substitute for coursework.

I will have more than 60 credits by summer 2018. Can I still apply?

YES, but applicants cannot have more than 60 units at time of application to SHPEP.

You will need all official transcripts, one letter of recommendation, a complete online application. You must register using an AAMC account that you will create at time of application.

December 1, 2017- Application Opens
February 15, 2018 – Application Closes

Application Requirements

To be eligible for SHPEP, an applicant at time of application must:

- Be a college freshman or sophomore;
- Have an overall GPA of at least 2.5; and
- Be a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident, or an individual granted deferred action for childhood arrivals (DACA) status by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.

To be a competitive applicant at WesternU SHPEP, students must have completed the following coursework by program start:

- General chemistry (two semesters)
- One or more math courses, at least college-level algebra
- An introductory biology course including cell and molecular biology

Other factors for consideration include that a student:

- Identifies with a group that is racially/ethnically underrepresented in the health professions
- Comes from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background;
- Has demonstrated an interest in issues affecting underserved populations

Mornings @ WesternU

Students spend mornings in a state of the art team based learning classroom, reviewing and exploring key concepts in chemistry, physiology and anatomy, all contained in 6 real life clinical cases. Specialized instruction in physiology, anatomy, interprofessional interaction and health systems related to the case are provided, capped by Grand Rounds, where the case is resolved and discussed.

Afternoon hands-on rotations will be performed in small groups in the following clinical areas.

- Physical Therapy
- Podiatry
- Dentistry
- Pharmacy
- Optometry
